

.COVIDVACCINEINFOFORPTS (English version)

Duke Health's top priority is protecting the health and well-being of our patients, their loved ones, and our team members. We are following federal, state, and local guidelines for the safe, fair, and orderly distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine. Duke is partnering with the state to help make sure that all Duke Health patients have access to the vaccine and that our vaccine planning and distribution includes everyone. Many people want to get the vaccine, but the supply is limited. We are committed to providing fair distribution of the COVID-19 vaccine to follow federal and [North Carolina Department of Health & Human Services](#) (NC DHHS) guidelines.

Based on guidance from the CDC and NC DHHS, we are now giving vaccines to **all** people age 65 and older and anyone who works in health care. Priority is given to those 75 and older and health care workers.

There are several ways you can schedule an appointment for a COVID-19 vaccine:

- Schedule your appointment through your Duke MyChart account. If no appointments are available, check back often. We are adding appointment slots on a regular basis. If you are not signed up for MyChart yet, visit <http://www.DukeMyChart.org>.
- Join the waiting list from the Duke Health COVID-19 vaccine website. Our team will contact everyone on this list on a first-come, first-served basis to schedule an appointment. <https://www.dukehealth.org/covid-19-update/covid-19-vaccine-update>
- Call your primary care provider's office to schedule a vaccine appointment. If no appointments are available your name will be added to the waitlist. The vaccine will not be given at the primary care provider's office.
- Call the Duke COVID-19 Hotline at 919-385-0429. The hotline is open every day from 8:00 am to 8:00 pm. Please note that we are experiencing high call volume and long wait times on hold. We encourage you to join our waitlist (link above) instead of calling the hotline so we may reach out to you when an appointment is available.

We are working hard to schedule appointments for vaccines. Please be patient and understanding as we work to schedule your vaccine as soon as possible.

COVID-19 vaccines are only given at COVID-19 vaccine clinic locations. You will not be able to receive the COVID-19 vaccine at your health care provider's office.
