What your team members need to know

- All team members will be required to wear a face mask while working at one of our hospital or clinic sites. We will provide one mask per day. You should wear your Duke-issued mask for the entire shift. Please take care of this mask each day. You will only be provided a replacement if the mask becomes wet, visibly soiled or damaged. You should properly discard your mask in the appropriate bin at the end of your workday.

What to share with your team

- As our supply chain team works to ensure you have what you need, please know that some of the supplies you are accustomed to may look different and come from different manufacturers.
- A one-sheet was added to the document library to help explain the universal masking protocols for our team and provide answers to frequently asked questions.
- Please avoid wearing makeup with masks as it can make masks appear soiled even though these items are safe and decontaminated when returned to you.

What your team members should do

- Wear your ID badge between shoulder and waist with the photo side facing out at all times. Do not let visitors or patients follow you into the buildings through entrances where they would bypass screenings.
